

Dr. Ten Hagen received a B.S. (magna cum laude) from Cornell University and a Ph.D. in Genetics from Stanford University. She served as a Research Assistant Professor at the University of Rochester from 1992-2001 and then as a Senior Research Fellow in the National Institute of Diabetes and Digestive and Kidney Diseases at the National Institutes of Health from 2001-2004. In 2005, she was appointed as the Chief of the Developmental Glycobiology Unit in the National Institute of Dental and Craniofacial Research at the National Institutes of Health, where her laboratory studies the mechanistic role of protein glycosylation during eukaryotic development. She is an Editorial Board Member for *The Journal of Biological Chemistry* and for *Glycobiology* and also serves as a reviewer for numerous other scientific journals. She served as Editor for a special issue of *Seminars in Cell and Developmental Biology* focusing on glycobiology. She served as the Society for Glycobiology Representative to the International Glycoconjugate Organization.
